

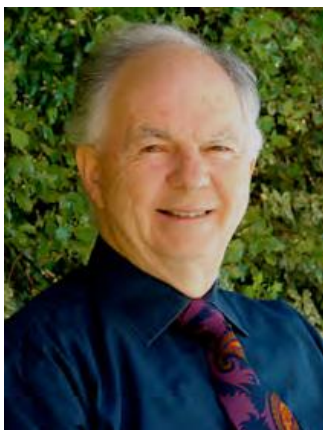
DIE BEITRAGENDEN/THE CONTRIBUTORS
